**Due to Very High Fire Danger the Kootenai National Forest
is under **Stage I Fire Restrictions****

Under Stage I the following acts are **prohibited** until further notice:

1. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire or campfire except within a developed recreation site or improved site. See below. Fires solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG Fuels are authorized in areas that are barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within three (3) feet of the device.
