The trainer will share strategies that are evidence-based, drawing from models such as **Attachment, Self-Regulation and Competency (ARC), Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), attachment theory and other related works.** These strategies will emphasize the environment, self-regulation, relationships and interactions-- not only as interventions, but also as protective factors that boost resiliency in young children.
