DECLARATION OF OPPOSITION TO I-186

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR LINCOLN COUNTY. **MONTANA FINDS:**

- 1. Montana is home to some of the most stringent mining permit requirements in the world;
- 2. At least 37 new state and federal laws have been enacted over the past three decades that ensure mining operations are strictly regulated and operated responsibly;
- 3. Montana has enjoyed a balance between agriculture, industry, outdoor recreation, and environmental protection;
- 4. The mining industry has created thousands of good-paying jobs to support generations of Montana families so they can remain in our state;
- 5. Individuals, businesses, and communities across Montana rely on the economic activity generated by our mining industry;
- 6. The mining industry delivers \$42 million annually in state and local tax revenue that support our schools, repair our roads, pay our teachers, and provide first responders with the tools they need to keep our residents safe;
- 7. The legal review of I-186 conducted by Montana Legislative Services revealed several ambiguous and confusing sections, undefined or ill-defined terms, and conflicting legal standards that would promote litigation and prevent mining in Montana;

THE BOARD RESOLVES:

That Lincoln County strongly opposes I-186, the unnecessary changes it would make to Montana's existing permitting structure and the negative impact it would have on mining operations in our state.

THE BOARD FURTHER RESOLVES:

1. If a provision of this resolution conflicts with a provision of a previously adopted

- 4. This Board directs that this resolution be entered into the minutes and signed by the Chair of the Board in accordance with § 7-5-121, MCA.
