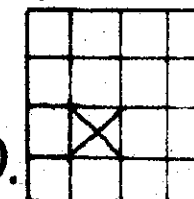

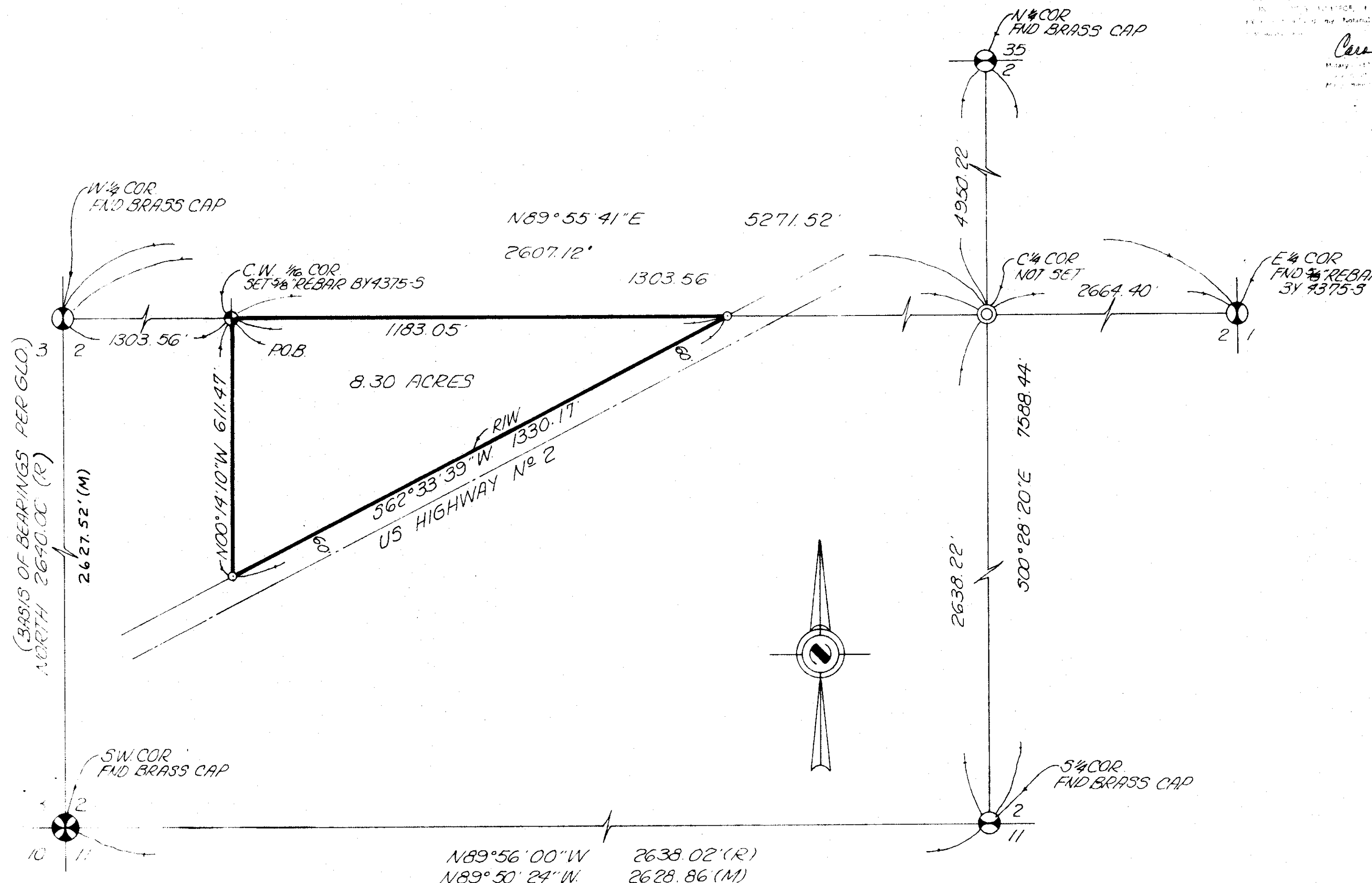
PURPOSE OF SURVEY: Divorcement of a tract
