MS NO. 6195 Montana, Robert C. Williams, U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, 1901

Corner No. 1

I commenced this survey at Cor. No. 1, identical with N.E. location corner, where I set a post, 4 1/2 ins. square, 5 ft. long, 2 ft. deep, marked 1-6195, for Cor. No. 1, and raised a mound of stone and earth around post.

The U.S.L.M. No. 6185, bears S.22°31'W., 2058.5 ft.

N.E. corner of concentrating mill, 70x140 ft., bears N.83°15'W., 232.8 ft.

Cor. No. 1 of Sur. No. 6189, bears S. 74°51'W., 1711.5 ft.

S.E. cor. Saw mill on Sur. No. 6196, 30x60ft., bears N.74°50'W., 307 ft.

MS NO. 6196 Kentucky, Robert C. Williams, U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor, 1901

Corner No. 1

I commenced this survey at Cor. No. 1, identical with S.E. location corner Cor. No. 1 of Sur. 6195, where is set a post, 4 1/2 ins. square, 5 ft. long, 2 ft. deep, marked 1-6195, I marked 1-6196, for Cor. No. 1 of this survey, there is a mound of stone and earth around post.

The U.S.L.M. No. 6185, bears S.22°31'W., 2058.5 ft.

Cor. No. 1 of Sur. No. 6194, bears S. 74°51'W., 1711.5 ft.

FOUND:

Found no remaining evidence of the original post or the mound of stone. There are partial remains of the buildings, however no sufficient evidence remains. It appears the 1910 fires destroyed the Millsite.

TO PERPETUATE:

At record position, set a 5/8" x 24" rebar, with a USFS 3-1/4" aluminum cap, 11" in the ground, marked as shown below and raise a mound of stones 30" x 12" to cap.

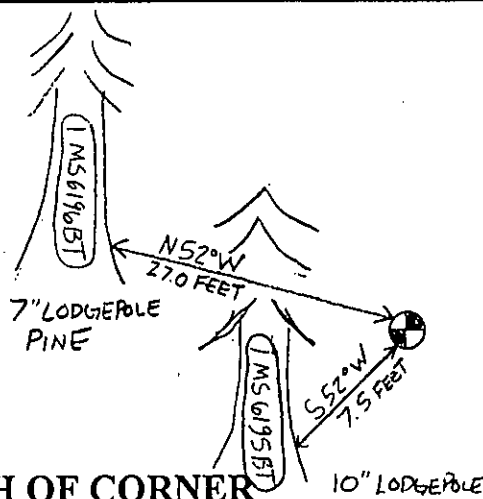
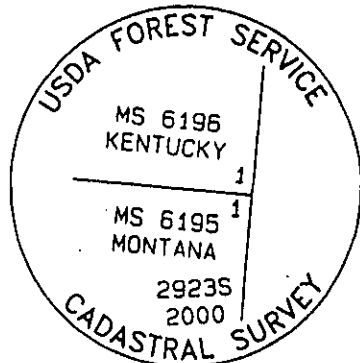
From which new trees:

A lodgepole pine, 10" in diam., bears S.52°W., 7.5', blazed and scribed "1 MS 6195 BT".

A lodgepole pine, 7" in diam., bears N.26°W., 27.0', blazed and scribed "1 MS 6196 BT".

Place a "Land Survey Monument" (54-9), and a "Bearing Tree" (54-3) sign on the bearing trees. Painted all blazes red, and a 6" red band above the "Bearing Tree" signs. Placed 6' steel posts on property line, 5' +/- from the corner, with "Land Survey Marker" (54-9), and "Property Boundary" (54-2) decals.
