Set iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2ins. dia., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap, from which:

Original bearing tree:

A 28" stump, bears S85 3/4°E, 45 lks (29.7 ft.), with a burned blaze A 26" dead, larch, bears S76 1/4°W, 132 lks (87.1 ft.), with burned blaze

A stumphole, bears N57 1/2°W, 84 lks (55.4 ft.)

New bearing trees:

A 5" larch, bears N78°E, 31 lks (20.5 ft.), marked T26N R29W S13 BT A 5" pine, bears S51°E, 29 lks (19.1 ft.), marked T26N R29W S24 BT A 9" fir, bears S05°W, 3 lks (2.0 ft.), marked T26N R29W S23 BT A 9" larch, bears N28°W, 7 lks (4.6 ft.), marked T26N R29W S14 BT

1985 Record: (Hill)

Found BLM monument protruding 4" above the ground, with brass cap. A 7" larch, bears N78°E, 30.4 lks (20.1 ft.), with healed face

A 13" fir, bears S05°W, 3 lks (2.0 ft.), with scribing partially visible

A 12" larch, bears N27°W, 7.1 lks (4.7 ft.), with scribing partially visible

New references:

A 14" larch, bears S50°E, 100.7 lks (66.5 ft.), scribed T26N R29W S24 BT

Steel guard post, 3.0 ft., north of corner

2009 Found:

We find a standard BLM monument with a 3 1/4" BLM brass cap, firmly set in good condition,

4" above the ground, marked as shown below, from which:

An 8" larch, bears N78°E, 20.1 ft., with overgrown blaze A 17" larch, bears S50°E, 66.5 ft., with overgrown blaze

A 16" fir, bears S05°W, 2.0 ft., with overgrown blaze & location tag A 26" dead, downed larch, bears S78°W, 88.0 ft., scribing not visible


A 14" larch, bears N27°W, 4.7 ft., with overgrown blaze A 5" pine, bears S51°E, 19.1 ft., with overgrown blaze

Steel post, 0.8 ft., northwest of corner

2009 Perpetuation:

We set a galvanized steel post with USFS decals P54-1 & P71-10, 0.6 ft., west of the monument. We paint red bands on the bearing trees, and attached USFS signs 54-3 & 54-9.
