

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears $870^{\circ}E$, 28 lks. dist., marked 1/4 s 31 BT.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N30 $^{\circ}$ W, 20 lks. dist., marked 1/4 s 36 BT.

1916 G.L.O. resurvey by F. WALTERS et al: Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor. for sec. 36 only, with brass cap marked:




and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor..

II. No original corner monument found, due road construction.


Established two new bearing trees:

A pine, 11 ins. diam., bears N11 E, 18.9 ft. dist., mkd. 1/4 \$36 BT. A larch, 11 ins. diam., bears 879° W, 53.0 ft. dist., mkd. 1/4 s36 BT.

Painted a red band around bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.

Set a 6 ft. galvanized steel guard post with Land Survey Marker and Property Boundary decals, SOUTH, 3 ft.
