### GLO - 1902 - Burton Adams and William Weeks

Set a limestone 18x10x8 inches, 12 inches in the ground for corner of Sections 8, 9, 16, and 17 marked with 4 notches on south and 4 notches on east edges; from which:

A fir, 5 inches diameter, bears N75°45'E, 28 links (18.64 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S9 BT.

A tamarack, 12 inches diameter, bears S14°30'E, 24 links (15.98 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S16 BT.

A fir, 8 inches diameter, bears S71°30'W, 33 links (21.78 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S17 BT.

A fir, 6 inches diameter, bears N42°W, 45 links (29.70 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S8 BT.

### **BLM - 1964**

Found stone 18x10x8 inches, loosely set, marked with 4 grooves on the east and south faces and witnessed by the original bearing trees:

A fir, 6 inches diameter, bears N751/4°E, 28 links (18.64 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S9 BT.

A larch, 14 inches diameter, bears \$141/2°E, 24 links (15.98 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W \$16 BT.

A fir, 9 inches diameter, bears S711/4°W, 33 links (21.78 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S17 BT.

A fir, 7 inches diameter, bears N42°W, 45 links (29.70 feet) distant, marked T27N R29W S8 BT.

At corner point, set an iron post, 30 inches long, 2½ inches diameter, 27 inches in the ground with brass cap marked as shown below. Bury the original stone along side the iron post.

## FOUND:

Found a 31/2" BLM brass cap, marked as shown below, 4 inches above ground with a small rock cairn around base of monument; from which:


