I. <u>1926 Mineral Survey original record by Charles H. Goodsell:</u> A fir post, 5 ft. long, 6 ins. square, set 2 ft. in the ground, with a mound of earth, scribed N. B. 3-10571. The NW Loc. Cor. bears N35° 52'W, 31 feet.

1970 Corner recordation by Stanley J. Shousen: Found orig. wooden post lying on the ground, plainly marked, with the rotted remains of the post underground. Found the NW Loc. Cor., a 118 in. diam. cedar, N35° 52'W, 31 feet. Found two unrecorded bearing trees:

A larch, 19 ins. diam., bears S6 1/2°W, 5.6 ft. dist., mkd. "BT NB 3 10571". A larch, 18 ins. diam., bears N69 1/2°W, 14.4 ft. dist., mkd. "BT NB 3 10571".

For cor. No. 3, "Northern Bell Lode" MS No. 10571, I set a 2 in. galvanized iron pipe 24 inches in the ground, with brass cap marked as shown. I set the iron post in the exact center of the rotted remains of the orig. wooden post.



II. Found a 2 in. diam. iron pipe, 5 in. above the ground, firmly set with a brass cap mkd. as shown above, from which:


A larch stump, bears S6°W, 5.6 ft. dist., no visible marks. A larch stump, bears N69°W, 14.9 ft. dist., no visible marks.

III. Established two new bearing trees:

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S45°W, 11.6 ft. dist., mkd. "3 NB 10571 BT". A larch, 24 ins. diam., bears S80°W, 16.8 ft. dist., mkd. "3 NB 10571 BT".

Painted red bands around the bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.
