
CERTIFIED CORNER RECORDATION

27W 7 & 18 28N P.M., MT Lincoln S.C. Secs. T. R. County Corner

1891 G.L.O. Record by Newton Orr: A point about 300 feet below last sec. cor., set a limestone, I. 15x10x7 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 7,12,13 and 18, mkd. with 2 notches on the N. and 4 notches onthe S. edges. Established four bearing trees.

1902 Retracement Survey Record by Burton S. Adams et. al.: The cor. for secs. 7,12,13 and 18, which is a stone 10x7, 5 ins. above ground, mkd. and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, as this cor. will hereafter refer to secs. 7 and 18 only, I efface the marks from the S.W. and N.W. bearing trees.

1970 B.L.M. Record by Joseph E. French: The cor. of secs. 7 and 18, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a limestone, 15x10x5 ins., firmly set, mkd. with 2 notches on the N. and 4 notches on the S. edges, and witnessed by the remains of the original bearing trees. At the corner point, set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with a brass cap, mkd. as shown.



Established two new bearing trees and bury the original stone alongside the iron post.

H. Found a 2 1/2 in, diam, iron pipe, firmly set, protruding 6.5 ins. above the ground, with a 3 1/4 in, diam. brass cap, mkd. as shown, and witnessed by the remains of the original bearing trees and the B.L.M. bearing trees.

from which:

A larch, 8 ins. diam., bears N11°E, 53.5 ft. dist., with visible scribe. (BLM-record)

A down pine snag, 8 ins. diam., bears S26°E, 18.5 ft. dist., with visible scribe. (GLO-record)

A larch, 9 ins. diam., bears S87°E, 30.4 ft. dist., with visible scribe. (BLM-record)

A larch, 18 ins. diam., bears N30°W, 47.0 ft. dist., with visible face. (GLO-record)

Set one 6 ft. galvanized steel guard post, East, 3.0 ft. dist. of the corner, with Property Boundary III. and Land Survey Monument decals attached.

Painted bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.

Magnetic Declination: 20° East
