1964 B.L.M. remonumentation record by Gerald F. Pittman et al: Set iron post with brass cap, marked as shown:

T29N R30W S19 | S20 S30 | S29 1964

Establish three new bearing trees.

1985 Corner Recordation by Thomas C. Hill, Reg. #5612: "I found a BLM monument, protruding 8 ins. above ground, with a brass cap marked as described in the BLM records, from which the following references:

Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears $N45^{\circ}E$, 48 lks. dist., with a healed face. Saw stump, 26 ins. diam., bears $N53^{\circ}E$, 68 lks. dist., with no scribing visible. Stump, 4 ft.. diam., bears $S24^{\circ}E$, 84 lks. dist., with no scribing visible. Roots and remains, bears $S79^{\circ}W$, 48 lks. dist., with no scribing visible. A pine, 11 ins. diam., bears $S89^{\circ}W$, 46 1/4 lks. dist., with healed face. A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears $N32^{\circ}W$, 39 1/2 lks. dist., with healed face.

Established the following new references:

Larch, 7 ins. diam., bears 865° E, 37 3/4 lks. dist., mkd. T29N R30W S29 BT.

Set a guard post, with a "Survey Marker" decal attached, 3 lks. N. from corner."

II. Found a 2 1/2 ins. diam. iron pipe, 12 ins. above the ground, loosely set (evidence that pipe was disturbed by caterpillar) with 3 1/4 ins. diam., B.L.M. brass cap, marked as shown above



A larch, 7 ins. diam., bears S65 E, 24.7 ft. (37 lks.) dist., healed face.

III. Reset pipe by distance - distance intersect from 1985 record data.
Set a 6 ft. galvanized steel guard post with Land Survey Marker and Property Boundary decals, South, 3 ft.
Painted red bands around the bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.
