The new corner monument was established as a result of a subdivisional survey of the Section. Said subdivisional survey was made in accordance with methods and procedures contained in the <u>Manual of Surveying Instructions</u> (1973); U.S. Bureau of Land Management.


ESTABLISHED:

Set a 31/4" aluminum cap on 5/8" x 30" rebar marked as shown below, flush with ground; from which:

A 9" Fir bears N81¾°W, 32.7 feet distant, blaze and scribe "CN1/16 S2 BT". A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears S29½°E, 45.7 feet distant, blaze and scribe "CN1/16 S2 BT".

Set a steel post, 3.0 feet north and a post 3.0 feet west of corner monument. Bearing tree tags were attached and bearing trees were painted red.
