A pine, 14 ins. diam., bears  $825^{\circ}W$ , 20 lks. dist., with an overgrown blaze. (Record) A larch, 15 ins. diam., bears  $811^{\circ}W$ , 14 lks. dist., with an overgrown blaze. (Record  $811^{\circ}W$ , 17 lks.)

Bury the original stone alongside the iron post."

A downed lodgepole pine, 15 ins. diam., bears S25 W. 12.5 ft. (18.9 lks.) dist., mkd. with overgrown scribe blaze.


