Corner Reference Monument trees T. 31N R. 29W P.M.M. Lincoln County

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND, AND ORIGINAL RECORD (IF KNOWN)

At the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner common to Sections 1 & 2, T31N, R29W, P.M.M. Lincoln County, Montana, we find: A rock 16" x 14" x 7" set in other rocks with one face showing, upon which is carved $\frac{1}{4}$; this rock is upon the edge of steep side slope over a wide gulch through which runs the Cripple Horse Creek Road; (Record: "On edge of a gulch 3 chains wide and 20' deep, set a slate stone 16 x 14 x 6 ins. 11" in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ corner marked $\frac{1}{4}$ ") from which we find, an 8" dead tamarack snag (with plain scribing facing the corner) bearing N82°E 42 links; (Record: "From which a tamarack 7" in diameter bears N82° 40'E 42 links marks $\frac{1}{4}$ S11 BT") No trace of second BT, but Cripple Horse Road has been constructed through its location. (Record: "From which a tamarack 28" in diameter bears S79° 10' W 69 links)

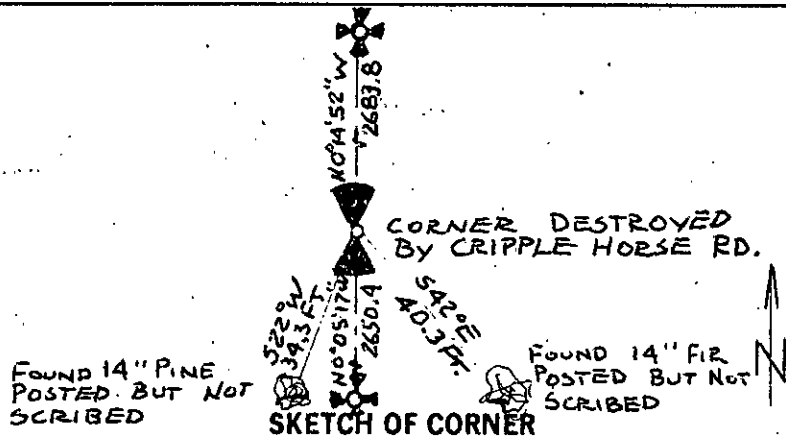
DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

Date of work: May 19, 1966

To perpetuate this corner we create two new reference monument trees, which bear from the center of the stone: A 10" Douglas-fir bears S42°E, 61 links, and a 12" ponderosa pine bears S22°W, 52 links distance; both bouble blazed and scribed RM. We piled rock around the original corner; We posted above corner rock with metal "monument sign"; put FS bearing tree posters on RM trees; we put a BLM bearing tree sign on the original 7" tamarack bearing tree; and we put up two new boundary signs on both ownership lines, one interior, and one between Sections 1 and 2.

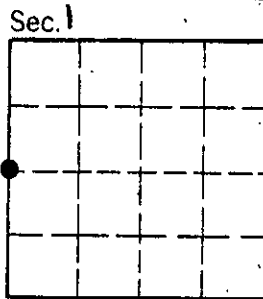
