

1962 B.L.M. remonumentation record by Gerald F. Pittman et al: "The closing cor. of secs. 7 and 18, monumented with limestone, 12x12x4 ins., firmly set and mkd. with 2 grooves on the N. and 4 grooves on the S. faces, and witnessed by the remains of the original bearing trees. At corner point; set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.



from which:

The remains of the original bearing trees:

A dead larch, 28 ins. diam., bears N69 E, 77 lks. dist., visible marks T31N R30W S7 BT.

(Record: N69 1/2 E, 82 1ks.)

A larch, 29 ins. diam., bears  ${\bf S46}^{\circ}{\bf E}$ , 5 lks. dist., with illegible scribing. (Record:  ${\bf S67}^{\circ}{\bf E}$ , 6 lks.)

The new bearing tree:

A pine, 11 ins. diam., bears  $N42^{\circ}E$ , 33 lks. dist., mkd. T31N R30W S7 CC BT.

Bury the original stone alongside of the iron post.


II. Found a 2 1/2 ins. diam. iron pipe, 3 ins. out of ground with a 3 1/4 ins. diam. B.L.M. brass cap, marked as shown above: from which:

- A dead top larch, 28 ins. diam., bears N75  $^{\circ}$ E, 50.6 ft. (77 lks.) dist., mkd. CC BT. A larch, 31 ins. diam., bears S48  $^{\circ}$ E, 4.2 ft. (6 lks.) dist., healed face.
- A pine, 15 ins. diam., bears N43°E, 21.8 ft. (33 lks.) dist., visible scribe.

III. Painted red bands around the bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.

set a 6 ft. galvanized steel guard post with Land Survey Marker and Property Boundary decals, North, 3 ft.
