I. 1903 G.L.O. Original Record by Allen B. Benedict: Set a limestone, 15x12x4 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 21,22,27&28, with 2 notches on S. and 3 notches on E. edges.

Established four bearing trees:

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N37°30'E, 48 lks. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W S22 BT".

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S65°30'E, 19 lks. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W S27 BT".

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears \$37°W, 7 lks. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W \$28 BT".

A pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N34°30'W, 33 lks. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W S21 BT".

II. Found a stone, 4x12 ins., firmly set, protruding 3 ins. above the ground, mkd. with 2 notches on the S. and 3 notches on the E. faces, and witnessed by the remains of three of the original bearing trees.


from which:

A rotten root crown, bears N37°E, 31.7 ft. dist., no visible marks. (GLO-record)

A shattered stump, w/ rotten log, bears S65°E, 12.5 ft. dist., with "BT" visible. (GLO-record)

A fallen rotten fir, bears \$37°W, 4.6 ft. dist., with "BT" visible. (GLO-record)

III. In the position of the found stone, as determined by the found original G.L.O. bearing trees, set an aluminum pipe, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 in. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap, mkd. as shown, raise a collar of stone.



Established four new bearing trees:

A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N62°E, 23.6 ft. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W S22 BT".

A hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears \$30°E, 20.1 ft. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W \$27 BT".

A cedar, 9 ins. diam., bears \$10°W, 6.6 ft. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W \$28 BT".

A hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears N41°W, 31.0 ft. dist., mkd. "T31N R34W S21 BT".

Painted red bands around the bearing tree and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.

Magnetic Declination: 20° East.
