40.00 chains - Set a limestone, 12X10X6 inches, 8 inches in the ground for the 1/4 corner, marked "1/4" on the West face, from which:

A 10" pine bears S83° E, 37 links (24.42') marked "1/4 S9 BT"

A 10" pine bears N51°30' W, 22 links (14.52'), marked "1/4 S8 BT"

1940 - A completion survey of the Township established the this corner as the 1/2 corner of Section 8 only...in place of the stone set an iron post 3 feet long, 28 inches in the ground for the 1/2 corner of Section 8 only, with the stone set flush to the surface on the west side of the post, with a brass cap. I erase the marks for the east bearing tree and establish 2 new bearing trees:

A 5" pine bears S70°W, 26 links (17.16'), marked "1/4 S8 BT" A 4" fir bears N42°W, 17 links (11.22'), marked "1/4 S8 BT"

## FOUND:

Found the 1940 GLO brass cap marked as shown below, bent to the south and 18 inches out of the ground, with the original stone on the east side of the brass cap approximately 1 foot out of the ground, and clearly marked with "1/4" on the west face. No evidence of the original bearing trees.


I straightened the brass cap and accepted the position of the brass cap.


I piled a mound of stones around the corner and buried stone upside down next to the brass cap. I established 2 new bearing trees:

A 10" spruce bears S43°W, 13.1 feet, marked "1/4 S8 BT"

A 13" fir bears N40° 30' W, 11.0 feet, marked "1/4 S8 BT"

I placed a 6 foot metal post with a Land Survey Monument decal 1.5 feet north of the comer. Bearing tree tags were attached to the new bearing trees and the blazes and scribing were painted with red tree paint.
