

**CERTIFIED LAND CORNER RECORDATION**


DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND, AND ORIGINAL RECORD (IF KNOWN)

1. E. 1/4 S. 32, T. 32 N., R. 31 W., M.P.M.--As per August 6, 1901 records, found a granite stone, unscribed, approximately 24"x10"x7" in demension, lying in the ground, from which a blown-down western larch (differeing species from record) root hole bears N.50 W. a distance of 23 links. The larch lays dead beside the hole, is 15" inner diameter, and has clear ax markings beneath which a "1/4" and part of a "2" are distinguishably scribed. Accepted the stone as original.
2. W. 1/4 S.32, T.32 N., R. 31 W.,M.P.M.-- No evidence, FOUND, ORIG. RECORD

b) S.1/16 S.31 and S.32, T.32 N.,R.31 W., M.P.M. CALLS FOR HEMLOCK POST.

2. A brass cap marked K.E.,M.D.L. 4232 S., 1/4, S.31/S.33, T.32 N.,R.31 W., 1978; two bearing trees {see sketch reverse side}.
3. a) A 1/2"x 24" steel pipe marked M.D.L. 4232 S.; two bearing trees.  
b) A 1/2"x 24" steel pipe marked M.D.L. 4232 S.; two bearing trees. {see sketch reverse side}




DIAGRAM OF CORNER:



1. E  $\frac{1}{4}$



Beside Brass Cap is the original granite stone. From Brass Cap a red fir, 2.0 ft. in circumference, bears S.  $22^{\circ}45'07''$  a distance of 32.3 ft. to its center. The tree has an "X" marked in it breast high with "BT" scribed in a notch at its trunk base. From Brass Cap a red fir, 4.2 ft. in circumference, bears N.  $69^{\circ}12'57''$  E a distance of 5.2 ft. to its center. The tree is scribed "W  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 33 BT."

2. W  $\frac{1}{4}$



Beside Brass Cap is a Granite stone 14" x 5" x 5" in dimension. From Brass Cap a red fir, 1.7 ft. in circumference, bears S.  $26^{\circ}26'10''$  E a distance of 18.4 ft. to its center. The tree has an "X" marked in it breast high with a "pk" nail in the "X"; a "BT" is scribed in a notch at its trunk base. From Brass Cap a red fir, 2.6 ft. in circumference bears N.  $53^{\circ}13'10''$  W. a distance of 27.9 ft. to its center. The tree is scribed "E  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 31 BT". A finish nail is in the scribed face.

3. a) W.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 32 -  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24" steel pipe capped M.D.L. 4232 S. from which a 2.4 ft circumference fir bears S.  $48^{\circ}57'20''$  E a distance of 65.0 ft to its center, scribed W.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 32. BT; and from which a power pole bears S.  $43^{\circ}00'50''$  W. a distance of 51.64 to its face. ; and from which the east part of a forked lodge pole pine bears S.  $3^{\circ}15'20''$  W a distance of 68.5 ft to its center. The forked part of the lodge pole is 3.0 ft in circumference and is scribed W.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 32 BT.
- b) S.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 31/S. 32 -  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24" steel pipe capped M.D.L. 4232 S. from which a 5.0 ft circumference western larch bears N.  $62^{\circ}01'20''$  E. a distance of 19.3 ft to its center and is scribed "S.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 32 BT"; and from which a 1.9 ft. circumference western larch bears N.  $66^{\circ}06'40''$  W. a distance of 34.6 ft. to its center and is scribed "S.  $\frac{1}{16}$  S. 31 BT."
