from which:

A pine, 4 ins. diam., bears S.41°15'W., 13 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S8 BT. A cottonwood, 5 ins. diam., bears N.83°W., 15 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S5 BT."

II. Found a stone, 7" x 9", protruding 4 ins. above the ground, firmly set, mkd. "1/4" on the N. face.


from which:

No evidence found of pine, at S41°W, 13 lks. distance.

A stump hole w/rotten crown, bears N83°W, 10.0 ft. distance.

A ponderosa pine, 12 ins. diam., bears \$28°E, 15.2 ft. dist., with a healed blaze (not of record).

III. In the position of the found stone, set an aluminum pipe, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap, mkd. as shown.


