1968 Record:

Original corner and bearing trees destroyed by logging operation.

We replaced w/ brass cap 2640 ft. west of section corner common to sections 17, 18, 19 & 20, T.32N, R.34W, MPM and on a straight line between said section corner and the section corner common to sections

18 & 19, T.32N., R.34 W. and section 13 & 14 T.32N., R35W., MPM

1982 Record: (Hill 5612 S)

No evidence of original monument or accessories was found.

Found brass cap as per the 1968 Ninneman survey. Established a corner position by single proportionate measurement along the section line. From this position, the found brass cap bears N59°42'W, 10.00 ft. Rejected the position occupied by the brass cap because: 1.) The position was determined by improper

methods, and 2.) a gross error existed in the reported measurement.

At the established single proportionate position, set a 2-1/2 ins. dia. x 30 ins. alum. pipe, 24 ins. in the

ground with a collar of stone. From which:

Fir, 20 ins. dia., bears N78°E, 27.7 ft., mkd "1/4 S18 BT" Fir, 5 ins. dia., bears S19°W, 6.2 ft., mkd "1/4 S19 BT"

2010 Found:

We find a 3-1/4 ins. dia. alum. cap, as shown below, 2-1/2 ins. dia. alum. pipe, rising 0.1 ft. from a collar of stone. From which:

Fir, Blown down and uprooted, 20 ins. dia., bears N74°E, 27.1 ft., face blaze, no visible scribing Larch, 8 ins. dia., bears S05°W, 6.2 ft., (Record S19°W), w/ overgrown blaze, no visible scribing

We also find the brass cap set by the 1968 survey. This brass cap bears N59°W, 10.5 ft., from the alum. cap set by the 1982 survey.


2010 Perpetuation:

We establish new reference monuments as follows:

Douglas Fir, 6 ins. dia., bears N13°E, 30.9 ft., scribed "T32N R34W S18 BT"

We set galvanized steel posts, North, 1.6 ft. and East, 5.6 ft. from the monument w/ LSM and USFS boundary decals.

Bearing trees were affixed with BT tags, snow blazed and a painted red band.
