Corner: <u>1/4 Corner, Secs. 19 & 24</u> T. <u>32N.</u> R. <u>34 & 35W.</u> P.M.M. <u>Lincoln</u> County

1903 GLO Record:

Set granite stone and established 2 bearing trees.

1987 Record:

Found granite stone, lying upside down in a small mound of stones.

(Hughes 7322 LS) From which:

Hemlock snag, 6 ft., bears N58°E, 2.5 ft. w/ visible scribing "1/4 S19 BT"

Stump hole, bears S76°W, 12.6 ft.

Distances were measured from the center of the marked stone.

The position of the stone was not accepted as the original corner position. The plainly scribed hemlock snag was accepted as the best available evidence for reestablishing the corner. At GLO bearing and distance from the snag, set a 2-1/2 ins. dia. x 30 ins. alum. post, 24 ins. in the ground, in a mound of earth, w/ 3-1/4 ins. dia. alum cap. Buried the original stone on west edge of monument.

The scribed hemlock snag, bears N47°E, 3.3 ft.

Stump hole, bears S80°W, 12.1 ft.

Established new bearing trees:

Douglas Fir, 5 ins. dia., bears East, 20.7 ft., scribed "1/4 S19 BT" Grand Fir, 6 ins. dia., bears S09°W, 18.3 ft., scribed "1/4 S24 BT" Set galvanized steel post, North, 2.0 ft., w/ LSM and USFS boundary decals.

2010 Found:

We find a 3-1/4 ins. dia. alum. cap, marked as shown below, on 2-1/2 ins. dia. alum. pipe, rising 0.4 ft.

from the ground. From which:

Rotten stump, 18 ins. dia., bears N47°E, 3.7 ft., w/ BT tag

Grand Fir, 10 ins. dia., bears East, 20.7 ft., w/ overgrown blaze & BT tag Grand Fir snag, 12 ins. dia., bears S07°W, 18.5 ft., w/ overgrown blaze & BT tag

Galvanized steel post, bears North, 1.7 ft.

2010 Perpetuation:


We establish new reference monuments as follows:

Cedar, 15 ins. dia., bears N64°W, 18.9 ft., scribed "1/4 S24 BT"

We set a galvanized steel fence post, South, 0.65 ft. from the monument w/ LSM and USFS boundary

decals.

Bearing trees were affixed with BT tags, snow blazed and a painted red band.
