DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND, AND ORIGINAL RECORD (IF KNOWN)

Orig: Set for Cor. No. 3, a quartzite stone 24x12x8 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, marked 3 H.E.S. 414 on NW. face, and a cross (x) on top for the exact corner point, from which

A cross (x) on a fir 12 ins. dia., bears S.25°40'E, 33 lks. dist.

A cross (x) on a black pine, 8 ins. dia., bears N.47°08'E., 3 lks. dist. each blazed and scribed 3 H.E.S. 414 BT.

Found: Found a stone marked as described in good condition, from which a stump hole bears N47°08'E 3 links distant, and a broken fir with legible scribing bears S25°40'E 33 links distant.

Note: The original survey was executed using a 31°06' East declination.

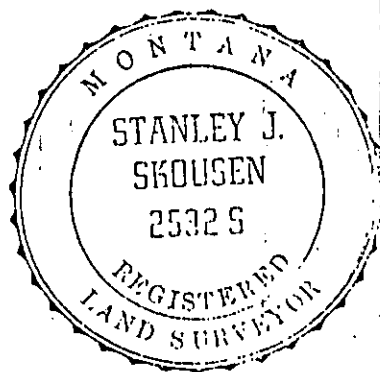
Two new bearing trees were established to perpetuate the corner position.

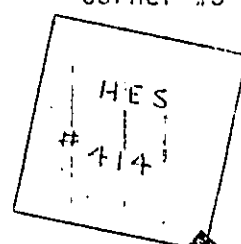
