Corner 1/4 Secs. 32&33 T. 33N R. 34W P.M., MT Lincoln County

I. 1912 G.L.O. Record by William C. Perkins: Set a shale stone, 16x8x5 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 32 and 33, mkd. "1/4" on W. face.

Established two bearing trees:


A pine, 4 ins. diam., bears S30°E, 29 lks. dist., mkd "1/4 S33 BT". A tamarack, 4 ins. diam., bears S42°W, 27 lks. dist., mkd "1/4 S32 BT".

II. Found stone, 6x7 ins., protruding 5 ins. above the ground, firmly set, mkd. "1/4" on W. face.

from which:

A larch, 6 ins. diam., bears S42°W, 17.8 ft. dist., with a burnt healed face. (record)

III. At the exact corner position, as determined by the found original stone and witnessed by one original bearing tree, set a 2 1/2 in. diam. aluminum pipe, 30 ins. long, 26 ins. in the ground, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap, mkd. as shown.



No live trees within limits for bearing trees.

Bury the original stone alongside the aluminum pipe.

Painted bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.
