I. 1912 G.L.O. Record by William C. Perkins: Set a slate stone, 16x8x6 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 27,28,33&34, mkd. with 1 notch on S. and 3 notches on E. edge.

Established four bearing trees:

A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N09°E, 18 lks. dist., mkd "T33N R34W S27 BT".

A cottonwood, 8 ins. diam., bears S27°E, 24 lks. dist., mkd "T33N R34W S34 BT".

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S64°W, 27 lks. dist., mkd "T33N R34W S33 BT".

A cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N58°W, 42 lks. dist., mkd "T33N R34W S28 BT".

II. Found stone, 8x5 ins., protruding 7 ins. above the ground, firmly set, mkd. with 1 notch on S. face, 4 notches on E. face.


from which:

A hemlock, 21 ins. diam., bears N09°E, 12.1 ft. dist., with a healed face.

A cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears S64°W, 17.8 ft. dist., with "33,34" visible.

A dead cedar, 19 ins. diam., bears N58°W, 27.7 ft. dist., with "34,2" visible.

III. At the exact corner position, as determined by the found original stone and witnessed by three of the original bearing trees, set a 2 1/2 in. diam. aluminum pipe, 30 ins. long, 26 ins. in the ground, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap, mkd. as shown.




Established two new bearing trees:

A hemlock, 9 ins. diam., bears S12°E, 35.8 ft. dist., mkd. "T33N R34W S34 BT". A cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N72°W, 14.6 ft. dist., mkd. "T33N R34W S28 BT".

Bury the original stone alongside the aluminum pipe.


Painted bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.
