


At the corner position as determined by survey, set a 5/8"x 30" rebar, with a $3\frac{1}{4}$ " aluminum cap, marked as shown:



From which:

A 9" Cedar, bears N20°E, 31.3' distant, scribed W E1/64 S17 BT. A 12" Douglas Fir, bears S35°E, 28.8' distant, scribed W E1/64 S20 BT.

Blazes and scribing were painted red. Bearing tree tags and Land Survey Monument signs were attached to trees. A 6' steel post with Land Survey Monument and Forest Service Property Boundary decals attached was placed 1.7' north of monument.
