
CERTIFIED CORNER RECORDATION

4&33 T. 33&34N R. 34W P.M., MT Corner County

I. 1903 G.L.O. Original Record by Allen B. Benedict: Set a granite stone, 15X10X4 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor. mkd. "1/4" on the N. face. Established two bearing trees.

1980 Certified Corner Recordation by Thomas C. Hill, Registration No. 5612S: The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, monumented with a stone, 12x7x4 ins., lying on top of the ground, in indentation, with "1/4" visible, face up, and witnessed by both original bearing trees. At the corner position, as determined by the found stone and bearing trees, set an aluminum pipe, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 in. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, with the brass cap mkd. as shown:



Established two new bearing trees:

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S32°W, 12.1 ft. dist., mkd. "1/4 S4 BT".

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N49°W, 15.1 ft. dist., mkd. "1/4 S33 BT".

Bury the original stone alongside and raise a collar of stone around the pipe.

Found a 2 1/2 in. diam. aluminum pipe, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap, firmly set, mkd. as shown II. above.

from which:

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S52°E, 26.2 ft. dist., with a healed face. (GLO-record-S58°E-27.0 ft.)

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S31°W, 12.3 ft. dist., with a healed face. (1980-record-S32°W)


A fir snag, 9 ins. diam., bears N49°W, 15.1 ft. dist., with a healed face. (1980-record)

III. Established one new bearing tree:

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears \$79°W, 32.1 ft. dist., mkd. "1/4 \$4 BT".

Painted bearing trees and attached Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs.

Magnetic Declination: 20° East.
