

- This corner set in original sruvey now falls in Marl Lake approximately 90 feet Therefore I set a monument on line between NW cor. of Sec. North of South shore. 3 and W.C. on south end of Deep Lake.
- Set 31" aluminum cap on a 30" aluma pipe stamped as shown below from which A 13" Larch (scribed SC4S4BT) bears S34 W 37.4 ft. An 11" larch (scribed WC4S3BT) bears S38°E An 11" larch (scribed WC\s3BT) bears S38°E 36.3 ft. A location poster on a 14\sum larch bears S22°E 16.5 ft.
