The point for the corner falls on a rock in place 5X4X3 feet above the ground, on which I cut a cross (X), at the exact point for the comer of Sections 25, 30, 31, and 36, with 1 groove south and 5 grooves north of the same. Raise a mound of stone 2 feet at the base and 1 1/2 feet high west of the corner.


Evidence Found: Found the mound of stone at the base of a rock that measures approximately 5X4X3 feet out of the ground. The mound was definitely man made and of the dimensions called for in the original notes. I found questionable evidence of the notches north of the "X" and no evidence of the notch to the south. I was unable to find the "X" for the exact corner position. By using the mound of stones as the best available evidence and establishing the corner position 3 feet east of the mound as outlined in the 1902 Manual of Surveying Instructions, the call to the top of the ridge running east(501.6 feet) fit within 1 foot of the original notes. I accepted said position using the mound of stones as the best available evidence.

Set: At the position established 3 feet east of the mound of stones I set an aluminum rock cap 3 1/2" in diameter, in concrete, marked as shown below, from which:

A 12" larch bears N63° E, 31.8 feet, marked "T34N R31W S30 BT" An 8" lodgepole pine bears S49° E, 31.35 feet, marked "T34N R31W S31 BT" A 16" Douglas fir bears S22°W, 36.7 feet, marked "T34N R32W S36 BT" An 11" Alpine Fir bears N36°W, 68.9 feet, marked "T34N R32W S25 BT"

I attached bearing tree tags to the new bearing trees and painted the blazes red. I set a 6 foot metal post 2 feet west of the corner by the mound of stones. The corner falls at the bottom of a 20 foot high rock shelf approximately 500 feet west of the ridge on Flatiron mountain.
