No. 1, H.E.S. 405 on N. face (HES 407 rcd: marked 1 H.E.S. 407 on E. face). From the cross (x) on top

A cross (x) on a larch 8 ins. dia., bears N83 56'E, 115 lks. dist.

A cross (x) on a black pine, 12 ins. dia., bears N29 02'W, 110 lks. dist.; each blazed and scribed 1 H.E.S. 405 BT.


Raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high E. of corner


III. Established one new bearing tree:
