

Set for Cor No. 10 a small stone, marked with a cross (X) under a granite stone, 26x16x8 ins. 16 ins. in the ground, marked 10 H.E.S. 787 on the NE. face and a cross on top for the exact corner point. From which:" Two bearing trees and a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, NE. of corner.

1960 B.L.M. Resurvey by D. Cunningham: "Cor. No. 10 of Tract B, H.E.S. No. 787, monumented with a granite stone, 24 imes 16 imes 8 ins., set and marked as described in the official record and witnessed by the remains of original bearing trees. At the corner point set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, in concrete, with brass cap mkd.



Bury the original stone alongside and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, NE. of the iron post."


