

CERTIFIED LAND CORNER RECORDATION

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND, AND ORIGINAL RECORD (IF KNOWN)

Descriptions of corner evidence searched for involved many corners. Except for the brass cap at the SW corner of the Section and the two spikes in the pavement ( at the NW corner and the SE corner ) all corners used were original stones found in place.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES ESTABLISHED  
TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

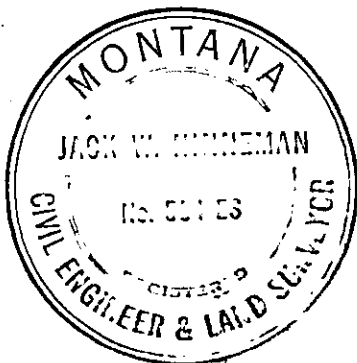
At the northeast corner of subject Section 11 we set a standard brass cap monument in a mound of stone on a steep south slope near the summit of a bare hill 3/4 mile east of the junction of Hwy 37 and U.S. 93  
No bearing trees in limits.

The corners set as shown on reverse were set by specified procedures, double proportionate distances and single proportionate distances. Angulation was measured with a one second Wild theodolite.
