
> A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S 19°E, 60 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 36 BT. A pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N 13°W, 42 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 25 BT.

1970 B.L.M. remonumentation by Joseph E. French: The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 36, monumented with a washed boulder, 13 x 10 x 7 ins., firmly set, marked 1/4 on the N. face, and witnessed by the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 18 ins. diam, bears S 19°E, 60 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 36 BT. A pine stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N 13°W, 42 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 25 BT.


