
Found a 4½ foot Obelisk 9x9 inches at the base, set in concrete and marked 242 on west face, and painted silver. No bearing trees were found.

New bearing trees:

A fir 7 ins. bears S 51 E 39.70 feet scribed T37N R28W MON 242

A fir 8 ins. bears S 20 W 21.50 feet scribed T37N R28W MON 242

Bearing trees had 6 inch bands and there scribe painted red, along with the required signs attached, a U.S.D.A. steel post was set South 19.57 feet from the corner.
