

I. 1915 U.S. Forest Service original record by Fred E. Thieme: Set for Cor. No. 4, a small stone, marked with a cross (X), under a quartzite stone, 24 x 10 x 7 ins., 14 ins. in the ground, marked 4 HES 506 on E face, and a cross (X) on top for the exact corner point, from which:

A cross (X) on a larch tree, 12 ins. diam., bears N 66° 28'W, 11 lks. dist. A cross (X) on a fir tree, 15 ins. diam., bears S 24° 13'E, 10 lks. dist., each blazed and scribed 4 H E S 506 BT.

Raised a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E of corner.

II. Found a 2 1/2 in. daim. aluminum pipe, firmly set in a small collar of stone, 9 ins. above the ground, with a 3 1/4 in. diam. aluminum cap mkd. as shown. No record found for the origin of this monument.


