



- Expanded food safety trainings to North Lincoln County: 39 passing students
- Submitted Standards 1, 3 and 5 of FDA Voluntary Standards

- Planning and Floodplain Administration moved to a newly created Planning Department, allowing our land use sanitarian to focus on Wastewater Treatment & Disposal and Sanitation in Subdivision.
- Lincoln County Wastewater Treatment and Disposal Regulations were updated in March, the first update in **5** years.
- Offered a site evaluation class in May to provide training on soils and percolation test procedures to licensed septic installers.
- Licensed 15 qualified site evaluators
- Staff inspected over 95% of permitted septic system installations.
- Of the applications received, **151** were in Eureka area, **82** were in Libby area and **53** in Troy area.

Air Quality

- In August, EPA redesignated the Libby area as attainment for the 1997 annual PM 2.5 standard
- The online permitting platform was expanded to the rest of Lincoln County for burns overseen by other agencies


Other Environmental Health Programs

- Hauled 44 junk vehicles through Junk Vehicle Grant
- Accepted 43 junk mobile homes for disposal. That is a 187% increase from 2022.
