Kathleen Sheffield, Lincoln County Victim Witness Advocate, requested approval to apply for a grant from the Office for Victims of Crime for FY24. The grant, titled "Meeting the Basic Needs of Crime Victims in Underserved Communities" provides services such as mentoring, technical assistance and budgeting support to grant awarded agencies. This grant would be facilitated by the Victim Witness program and supervised by the County Attorney in providing these community services. Commissioner Teske verified with Kathleen her ability to manage this responsibility and she confirmed this opportunity would enable her to promptly aid those requiring assistance. **Motion** to approve the application for the grant for the victim witness by Commissioner Teske. Second by Commissioner Hammons. No comments. Motion carried.

11:30 AM Abandon County Road Between Lots 1 & 8 of Block 9 and Lots 5 & 6 of Block 8 between Pinewood Lane and Tamarack Lane: Present were Brian Phillips and Noel Duram.

Commissioner Teske presented a petition from neighbors with road frontage to a section of road originally platted on the Pinewood Village Subdivision #2589 in 1969 but was never developed or utilized. This is a portion of Creekwood Road running north located between lots 1 and 8 of block 9 and lots 5 and 6 of block 8, between Pinewood Lane and Tamarack Lane. He and Jerry Regh, Libby Road Supervisor, reviewed it and have no issues with the abandonment, advising it is dirt and grass with many encroachments and has not been used or maintained by the county. This would be equally split by the adjoining property owners and added to the tax rolls. **Motion** to move forward with public notice and hearing process by Commissioner Hammons. Second by Commissioner Teske. No comments. Motion carried. Public hearing will be noticed and held July 24th, 2024.

11:45 AM J Neils Bull Removal and Relocation Proposal: Present were Brian Phillips and Noel Duram.

Dave Harman requested the Commissioners remove the bull situated at J Neils Park. He mentioned that LOR has donated a million dollars to the community and suggested there might be funding available for this initiative. He mentioned consulting with several organizations about his proposal, which involves relocating the bull and installing new statues at J Neils Memorial Park. Christine Neils Lee stated the Neils family supports this change. Gary Huntsberger advised the Rotary would like to see that location used more appropriately as determined by a community contest. Patty Rambo, representing the Kootenai River Stampede PRCA Rodeo, expressed her preference to keep the bull as it is and provided a counter proposal to incorporate an additional display on the opposite side of the park entrance. Commissioner Teske confirmed through Joe Nagle, Maintenance Director, that this relocation would not hinder maintenance operations. Joe confirmed the site near the flagpole would not pose issues. It was decided to revisit this request at next week's meeting.
