Flooding Disaster Update for Lincoln County

Lincoln County Emergency Management is providing an updated briefing on local flooding impacts and ongoing response efforts. This remains a coordinated operation involving multiple local, state, and federal agencies working together to protect public safety, assess damage, and guide recovery efforts.

Emergency Operations continue to prioritize situational awareness and response coordination today. Bridge inspectors will be on the ground and assessing infrastructure conditions. At least five bridges have been damaged or destroyed, and the 5th Street Bridge remains a top priority but is still closed due to safety concerns.

Water System and Safety Updates

City of Libby Boil Order

The boil water order for the City of Libby remains in effect. Residents should boil water for at least one minute before using it for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth, or dishwashing.

Flower Creek Reservoir

The Flower Creek Reservoir remains intact and fully operational.

Public Safety Reminders

Residents are reminded to use extreme caution around floodwaters and saturated areas:

- Avoid traveling on water-saturated or flooded roads. Even shallow water can hide structural damage or cause loss of vehicle control.
- Do not go around road closure signs.
- Stay away from riverbanks, creeks, and ditches where erosion and rapid changes can occur.
- Give responders space to operate by keeping travel in affected areas to essential trips only.

Your cooperation helps keep both the public and responders safe.
